

SSCA 2020 Directory - Call For Volunteer(s)



Water levels continue to be well above average and near or above record high levels. From a month ago the water levels on Lakes Superior, **Michigan-Huron** and St Clair are 4, 1 & 2 inches lower respectively, Lakes Erie and Ontario are 2 and 1 inches higher, respectively.
